Upcoming issues of *democracy* will focus on the themes of "Defense and the National Security State" and "Religion and Democracy." Among the planned articles are: Julius Lester on morality and education; James M. Skelly on the demise of the citizen soldier; Robert Wuthnow on evangelicals and the public sphere; Mary Kaldor on nuclear weapons and the Atlantic Alliance; and Christopher Hill on radicalism and religion.

The January issue will feature Carlos Fuentes on Mexican-U.S. relations; Joel Rogers on politics and markets; Wilson Carey McWilliams on Walter Lippmann; and William Leach on Edward Bellamy and feminism.

Future issues will contain Lawrence Goodwyn's reassessment of James Agee and Walker Evans's classic *Let Us Now Praise Famous Men*; and Larzer Ziff on the literary remains of Lionel Trilling.
